JOB SUMMARY: The ideal candidate will be responsible for assisting a classroom teacher with instructional programming during daily summer school hours (9:00 - 11:30 AM) for students in grades K - 5. After summer school ends, students transition into a summer day camp environment. Summer Enrichment Coordinators will be responsible for the day-to-day management of staff, students, and the overall program. They will support Summer Enrichment Counselors by preparing, organizing, and planning various activities outside of summer school hours (11:30 AM - 5:30 PM). Summer enrichment Coordinators will ensure a fun, safe, secure, and structured environment for all participants.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Must be 21 years of age or older.
- 2. Must be able to pass a criminal background check.
- 3. Must have reliable transportation to and from the job site.
- 4. Experience working with youth of diverse backgrounds and abilities preferred.
- 5. Strong leadership, communication, and decision-making skills.
- 6. Ability to work with children in an enthusiastic and positive manner.
- 7. Ability to establish and maintain positive working relationships.
- 8. Good character, integrity, patience, and adaptability.
- 9. Have, or have the ability to complete during staff training, Mandatory Reporter, and First Aid/CPR certifications. Additional certifications may be required depending on the program area.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential job functions.

- 1. Use of hands, fingers, arms, feet and legs to perform daily duties.
- 2. Ability to speak and hear.
- 3. Significant sitting, standing, walking, and physical activity.
- 4. Significant amount of time spent outdoors.
- 5. Ability to lift and carry fifty (50) pounds.
- 6. Ability to constantly interact with the public in a professional manner.
- 7. Ability to perform professionally in stressful situations.
- 8. Ability to follow proper wearing, cleaning and/or replacement procedures of Personal Protective equipment (masks, gloves, etc.) all day in all climates.
- 9. Visual and auditory ability to identify and respond to environmental and other hazards related to the activity.
- 10. Physical ability to respond appropriately to situations requiring first aid /CPR. Must be able to assist campers in an emergency (fire, evacuation, illness, or injury) and possess strength and endurance required to maintain constant supervision of campers.

- 11. Eye-hand coordination and manual dexterity to manipulate program equipment.
- 12. Operate with daily exposure to the sun and heat and varying weather conditions.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Oversee special and theme-specific camp programming:
 - Uphold program quality expectations in all activities
 - Plan, execute, and assist counselors in programming including but not limited to crafts, games, and other special activities
 - Ensure all relevant safety regulations and ACA standards are followed
- 2. Support summer enrichment staff:
 - Communicate any staff concerns to the Administrative Team
 - Mediate and solve problems that may arise between staff
 - Provide encouragement and support to summer enrichment staff
- 3. Ensure cleanliness and organization of shared spaces.
- 4. Serve as a resource for behavior management techniques, technical skills, and program policy to all Summer Enrichment Counselors.
- 5. Ensure the safety and well-being of campers at all times:
 - Help students have fun, take risks, make friends, resolve conflicts, and develop skills
 - Provide encouragement to all students and motivate them to participate in new/challenging activities
 - Provide compassionate, respectful, and honest guidance/support to students when they misbehave
 - Recognize and respond to opportunities for problem solving in the group
 - Provide First Aid to students and staff as needed within counselor scope of practice
- 6. Be a positive role model for youth in language, dress, behavior, and attitude.
- 7. Communicate with parents in a timely manner regarding any incidents or concerns
- 8. Teach and explain rules and expectations to students.
- 9. Work cooperatively with other staff.
- 10. Cooperate with parents of students. Communicate any concerns to the Administrative Team.
- 11. Manage personal time off in accordance with camp policy.
- 12. Submit all required reports, evaluations, and incident reports.
- 13. Perform other duties as assigned by the Administrative Team.

PAY: \$400-\$600/week depending on experience, prorated as needed for requested time off.
